Uniform Policy

This policy is part of the overall strategy of the school and operated within the context of our vision, aims and values as a Church of England School

Aims

Having a smart school uniform for all children:

- Helps to create a feeling of community
- Supports the principle of inclusion
- Is suitable and appropriate for school activities
- Promotes a sense of pride
- Avoids the distraction or pressure of fashionwear

We pride ourselves on a smart appearance in school and we politely ask that all children wear the full Hindon Primary School uniform (this includes wearing polishable black shoes, avoiding the extremes of hairstyle and refraining from wearing makeup or Jewellery).

Purchasing Uniform

Uniform can be purchased from a variety of suppliers:

- Online via our uniform providers Brigade and School Trends (items with a school logo) via the school website.
- Supermarkets, department stores etc. (for uniform without the school logo).
- Pre-loved/ second hand items are available from the school (PTA). We support and encourage sustainability through re-using uniform.

Children are only required to wear a sweatshirt/cardigan with a logo.

School Uniform

- White or sky blue polo shirt (plain or with the school logo)
- Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan (with the school logo)
- Grey trousers, formal shorts, pinafore dress, culottes or skirt (knee length)
- Blue and white summer dress when weather is suitable (optional)
- Plain black **polishable** shoes or boots in the winter
- Plain navy, white or grey socks or tights (no logo sports socks please)
- Wellies (to be left in school)

- Year 6 are permitted to wear their Leavers' hoodies for certain activities **in term 6*** as a privilege. **The design and colour for the Leavers' hoodies must be agreed in advance with the Headteacher. No 'nicknames' are permitted.**

PE/Games/

PE kits should remain in school. Children are expected to change for PE.

- Plain white or sky blue t-shirt for twice weekly PE
- Plain navy shorts (not tightly fitted)
- Trainers (please no laces until they can be tied independently)
- Navy fleece/sweatshirt and navy tracksuit bottoms for outdoor games when cold
- White, navy or grey socks (children should not wear tights for PE)

Forest School kit

- Coat - navy, black or grey waterproof and warm school coat
- Wellington Boots
- Waterproof over trousers
- Sun hats/winter hats/gloves/scarves
- [Jewellery, makeup and hair accessories etc.](#)
- Jewellery should not be worn to school due to health and safety concerns and the potential for loss.
- If children have pierced ears, then small studs only may be worn
- Nail varnish, transfer tattoos and makeup should not be worn
- Extreme hair styles are not acceptable (e.g. with designs cut in)
- Long hair should be tied back with plain hair ties and hairbands should also be plain (without attachments or accessories)
- The extremes of hairstyles should be avoided

Other

Please note that children in the new Reception class will be given a book bag so do not need to purchase one.

All items of clothing should be labelled with your child's name.
