Adventures in the Amazon!

History

Adult support is important for this task as some images generated by Google may include members of certain tribes who are not wearing clothing.

Research an indigenous tribe of the Amazon (for example, the Yanomami). Children can draw a picture of daily life and write a few sentences about how people lived in the past and how this compares to life today.

Geography

Create a simple fact page or mini poster about the Amazon Rainforest. You can locate it on a map, label the continent and countries it covers, and include key facts such as climate, rivers, and animals.

Art

Create a piece of rainforest artwork using paint, crayons, collage, or natural materials. Focus on bright colours, animal patterns, or layered jungle scenes inspired by rainforest plants and wildlife.

DT

Design and build a small model shelter that could survive rainforest weather using recycled materials (cardboard, paper, plastic). You can explain why your shelter would protect people from rain and heat.

ICT

Use a computer (with adult support) to create a short Power Point about the Amazon Rainforest. This could include images, facts or a short typed paragraph about what you have learned.

Science

Make a rainforest food chain. You can draw or cut out plants and animals and arrange them to show who eats what, explaining why rainforests are important habitats.
